Central Office Delegates Meeting Minutes at the Paseo Group

July 8, 2018

Dianne, the Delegates Chair, opened the meeting at 10:00 am with a moment of silence followed by the Declaration of Unity. All present were reminded to turn off the volume of their cell phones and to please be sure to sign the sign-in sheet, making sure that their information is correct. She thanked everyone for being present early and explained why she was reading the unity statement.

Matt N., gave the Secretary's report. The minutes were provided and e-mailed out to the delegates. A motion was made to approve the minutes and was seconded. The minutes were approved by vote.

Art S., gave the Treasurer's Report for June 2018. The total Income for June was \$ 11,893.22, less Expenses of \$ 16,027.27 leaving a net loss of \$ 4,134.00. Art explained that it loss sounds bad, but it really is not. The Central Office is well within the operating budget and has not had to yet touch the prudent reserve. He also explained that the Central Office is a not for profit organization and the goal is actually to break even in the end. Vaughn asked if there was anything to attribute the loss to. The question was answered by both Art S. and Teresa that yes the group donations were down. Also they are still making payments on the new website. Teresa made it known that the 501 c3 status wasn't previously being used to the fullest extent possible and she is working on making sure that tax exemptions are being used where possible. Art further made it known that the board meetings are open to all who wish to come and get to know what is going on there.

Derrick., gave the Board Report for June 2018. The board had the June 20 board meeting. There GFI gave a proposal for the new copier and the desktop printers. The Central Office would save about 100 dollars a month under this proposal. The board voted to approved the proposal. The Central Office had been paying tax, but now are going to be getting a refund on the taxes that had paid since the Central Office is a 501c3. The board has some concerns in the balances differences each month, but the finances are ok. Teresa mentioned the old printers will be kept safe in the storage unit, for Central Office events when a printer will need them. Also the Central Office had been paying some surcharges about quarterly of \$80.00 - \$100.00 and that will go away now as well.

Office Report - CO Director, Central Office Director, gave the Office Report. The shelves are stocked and the bills are paid. It was mentioned that the picnic went very well and she thanked everyone that attended and the speakers for speaking as well. She reiterated that she is working on getting the best possible exemptions allowed as a 50It was stated that she is taking resumes for a new office manager which is a paid position. The question was asked if we the tax exemption will get us a better deal on literature and was answered that we never pay tax on literature. Another question was asked that if changes are made to meeting times and submitted to the Central Office if the change will be universal across the directory and web site etc. and answered in the affirmative. Mention was made about the controversy surrounding the Area 39 archives kept in the Central Office. A bit of history was provided about this relating the comments made by a previous disgruntled employee of the Central Office. It was clarified that the archives are more than welcome to remain in the Central Office. As of the current time the archives for Area 39 are and will remain in the Central Office building though Area 39 are apparently looking for different storage locations that offer more storage at a better cost.

Prairie Village Group: Never heard of the envelopes, but will bring it up at the next business meeting and see what they want to do. Serenity Group: They have never mailed one in before, but will bring it up to the group. Paseo Group: Gives one dollar each to the GSO, Group, and Central Office. They hand them out as speakers go to the podium to speak. Wing and a Prayer: The group has been lax on using them, but they do know about them. He will bring it up to the group. Turner Group: He does know of the envelopes

It's a great discussion as you forget as time goes on. He will bring it up at the next group business meeting. Bethel Group: Is aware of the envelopes, but they are not pushed at the group. He will bring it back up to the group. Harrison Group: The group is probably lacking on the use of the envelopes but there is discussion about it. Park Hill Group: did not mention anything about the envelopes but the group is doing well. Englewood Winners: Is sure that the group is aware of the envelopes and uses them. Roe Center Group: Doesn't know anything about the envelopes, but like the idea of handing one out to someone when they get a coin. Chapter 5 Group: didn't mention the envelopes, but mentioned that new comers are really doing well at the group. Group One: Knows nothing about the envelopes, but likes the idea and will bring it back to her group. We now have a five month prudent reserve. At the October, 2015 Board of Directors meeting a motion was made, seconded and passed that Central Office establish a six month prudent reserve. We are almost there.

2018 June Donations \$ 5,176.80

2017 June Donations \$ 3,974.61

Each group has the ability to make these numbers change. If you do not see your home group listed here, it is because Central Office has not received a donation. Please ask why. If your group feels we need to be of more service in some area, please let us know. We cannot change that of which we are ignorant.

As per your request, we are now publishing a more complete financial report. I hope this pleases those of you who have asked for it. If not, please let me know what else you would like to see. After all, this is *your* money! We at Central Office try to be good stewards of it.
