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ELECTION INFORMATION

All are welcome to attend the elections, but there is only one vote per group.

From the Central Office By-Laws:

Election of **Board of Directors – 2 Years of Sobriety required**

Three (3) members of the Board of Directors shall be elected by the Board of Delegates by majority vote of the members present at the meeting of the Board of Delegates held during April of each year. No member group shall have more than one nominee from that group for the Board of Directors per election. The nominees for the Board of Directors need not be members of the Board of Delegates. Newly elected Board of Directors members shall attend the April Board of Directors Meeting for orientation, but have no vote until May 1. Officers of the Board of Directors for the next term shall be elected at the April Board Meeting and all newly elected Board of Directors members and their elected Officers shall take office beginning May 1st of that year.

Election of **Delegate Officers**

Delegate Chair – Preside over the Delegate Meeting 2nd Sunday of each month or contact the Alternate Delegate Chair to do so. Attend the regularly scheduled monthly Board of Directors meeting. The Delegate Chair or the Alternate will have one (1) vote on the Board of Directors. Attendance at Central Office functions, such as: yearly Christmas Party, yearly picnic held in June or other special events held throughout the year is suggested. – **2 years of sobriety required**

Alternate Delegate Chair – The Alternate Delegate Chair shall fulfill all the duties of the Delegate Chairperson in the Chairperson’s absence. The Alternate Delegate Chair should attend all Delegate Meetings, Board of Director meetings and Central Office functions so as to be fully ready to fill the office of the Delegate Chair if needed. **2 years of sobriety required**

Secretary – Attend Delegate Meetings 2nd Sunday of each month, or contact Alternate to be in attendance. He/she shall assist the Director of the Central Office in preparing the agenda for the next month’s Delegate Meeting. The Secretary shall take comprehensive minutes of the Delegate meeting and have them submitted to the Central Office before the next Board of Directors meeting. He/she shall send out notices to the Board of Delegates and the Board of Directors, giving notice of date, time and location of the next Delegate meeting. **1 year of sobriety required**

Alternate Secretary - The Alternate Secretary shall fulfill the duties of the Delegate Secretary in the Secretary’s absence. The Alternate Secretary should attend Delegate meetings so as to be ready to fulfill the duties of the Secretary if needed. **1 year of sobriety required**

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Section V: Elections – BOARD OF DELEGATES

Election of Officers of the **Board of Delegates** shall occur at the monthly meeting held in April of each year and take office the following May 1st. Officers shall be elected by a simple majority vote either written or by a show of hands, as decided by the Board of Delegates. The Officers shall be elected from the active Delegates for a 1 year term. 2 years continuous non-use of alcohol, barbiturates, tranquilizers or any type of mood or mind changing drug and continuing non-use during term of office is required to serve as Chairperson or as Alternate Chairperson. 1 year of continuous non-use of alcohol, barbiturates, tranquilizers or any type of mood or mind changing drug and continuing such non-use during their term of office is required for the Secretary or their alternate.

Section V: Eligibility and Duties – BOARD OF DIRECTORS

To be eligible to serve on the **Board of Directors** he/she must be an active member of Alcoholics Anonymous with at least two (2) years of continuous non-use of alcohol, barbiturates, tranquilizers or any type of mood or mind changing drugs and must continue such non-use during his/her term of office. The job requirements are as follows:

1. Attend monthly Board meetings held at the Central Office.
2. Attend monthly Delegate meetings held at rotating AA group locations.
3. Assist at any Central Office function, such as Yearly Picnic, Christmas Party and various group visits as requested.
4. Learn about the functions of the Central Office and Service Structure so they can help educate groups and individuals, who may be uninformed.

No member group shall have more than one member serving on the Board of Directors at any given time in any capacity. No member of the Board of Directors shall be eligible to serve more than one (1) consecutive three (3) year term interspersed by at least three (3) years. Any member of the Board of Directors completing the term of a previous Board Member (per Article V Section IV) shall be eligible to seek election for their own three (3) year term.

Section VII: Director of Central Office

This position will be a salaried, non-rotating position.

Duties:

Responsible for the daily operations of the Central Office.

Shall carry out the policies decided by the Board of Directors as they affect the function and operation of the office.

Shall have absolute discretion to determine what vendors are used, merchandise is purchased, and pricing is established for all items for sale at the Central Office.

Shall be responsible for recruiting, training, scheduling, fixing salaries and outlining the duties of volunteers and paid staff to help with the daily functions of the Central Office.

Assist the Delegate Secretary with input from the Delegate Chair in preparation of the agenda for each month's meeting of the Board of Delegates and prepare the agenda for each month's meeting of the Board of Directors with input from the President of the Board of Directors.

Contact any Board of Directors member that has missed meetings without notice to affect a remedy to the situation or to accept their resignation.

Contact any Officer of the Board of Delegates who has missed meetings without notice to affect a remedy to the situation or to accept their resignation.

Attend Board of Delegates Meeting and report the status of the Central Office.

Attend Board of Directors Meeting and report the status of the Central Office.

Assist member groups in any reasonable manner i.e. group inventory, speaking or help in functioning as an A.A. group.

The Director of Central Office shall establish and maintain a modern and efficient system of bookkeeping and accounting. The books of the corporation shall be reviewed annually by a qualified accountant.

The Director of the Central Office shall have the power to administer assets, funds, income and make investments with the cooperation and approval of the Board of Directors.

The Director of the Central Office shall sign and execute on behalf of the Central Office all contracts, notes, deeds of trust, mortgages or other documents of every kind or nature that may be necessary in pursuance of the business of the Central Office with the approval of the Board of Directors.

In the absence of the Central Office Director, the Central Office Manager shall assume all duties and responsibilities of the Central Office Director. Such duties and responsibilities shall include but not be limited to, one vote on the Board of Directors.

The Central Office Director shall keep foremost in his/her mind the best interest of the Central Office, the groups this office serves and AA as a whole.

CONCEPT III

As a traditional means of creating and maintaining a clearly defined working relation between the groups, the Conference, the A.A. General Service Board and its several service corporations, staffs, committees and executives, and of thus insuring their effective leadership, it is here suggested that we endow each of these elements of world service with a traditional "Right of Decision."

Within the framework of their general responsibilities, whether these be defined by charter, by resolution, or by custom, it should be the traditional right of all world service boards, committees, and executives to decide which problems they will dispose of themselves and upon which matters they will report, consult, or ask specific directions. We ought to trust our world servants with these discretions, because otherwise no effective leadership can be possible. Let us consider in detail, therefore, why the need for a "right of decision" in our leadership is imperative, and let us examine how this principle can be applied practically in all levels of our structure of world service.
